# VISIONS OF GLAMOUR OR GLORY?



## Lesson 2

### WHAT MOST PEOPLE SEE IN THE TRAVELING MINISTRY

- They see the **glamour** of being treated as a guest.
- They see the **honor** given to the traveling ministry.
- They see the **anointing** that traveling ministers have.
- They see the **privileges** that traveling ministers have.
- They see the **offerings** that traveling ministries receive.

**NOTE:** The visible part of the traveling ministry is very small compared to all that has to be done to have a good traveling ministry.

### A REAL VISION FROM GOD FOR THE TRAVELING MINISTRY WILL PRODUCE

- A mandate to go.** Some traveling ministries I know did not have a desire to travel, but God said, "Go!"
- A desire to serve** the churches and the people. See how much you can give instead of how much you can receive.
- An anointing to confirm the call,** preach the Word, produce effective ministry, and get the work done.

Calling and purpose will determine the methods you are to use, and what kind of anointing God will give you.

**GOD HAS VARIOUS PURPOSES FOR DIFFERENT INDIVIDUALS**

Jesus had a purpose for manifesting in the flesh, and in going to Calvary.

*For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them... (Luke 9:56)*

*...For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil. (1 John 3:8)*

Paul knew the purpose to which he was called.

*But rise, and stand upon thy feet: for I have appeared unto thee for this purpose, to make thee a minister and a witness both of these things which thou hast seen, and of those things in the which I will appear unto thee; Delivering thee from the people, and from the Gentiles, unto whom now I send thee, To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me. (Acts 26:16-18)*

**CONCLUSION**

Whatever your purpose, realize you are appointed to do it by God. Do not compare yourself with others, who may not have a traveling ministry for the same purpose.

*For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise. (2 Cor.10:12)*

# IDENTIFYING YOUR ANOINTING



## Lesson 4

**Anointing** - *chrisma*, Gr.; an unguent, a smearing, a special endowment of the Holy Spirit, unction.

### THE CALL DETERMINES THE KIND OF ANOINTING YOU HAVE

When you are where God sends you and you are doing what God has told you to do, the anointing will be present and functioning.

Peter was anointed to go to the Jews.  
Paul was anointed to go to the Gentiles.

*But contrariwise, when they saw that the gospel of the uncircumcision was committed unto me, as the gospel of the circumcision was unto Peter;  
(For he that wrought effectually in Peter to the apostleship of the circumcision, the same was mighty in me toward the Gentiles:)  
(Galatians 2:7,8)*

Every person that is sent by God to do the work of the ministry will have a specific anointing upon them to fulfill that call. Certain anointings do not come because you want it or because you have someone lay hands upon you. The anointing comes with the call, and is manifested to accomplish God's purposes. That anointing will then increase as you labor in the call God has given you.

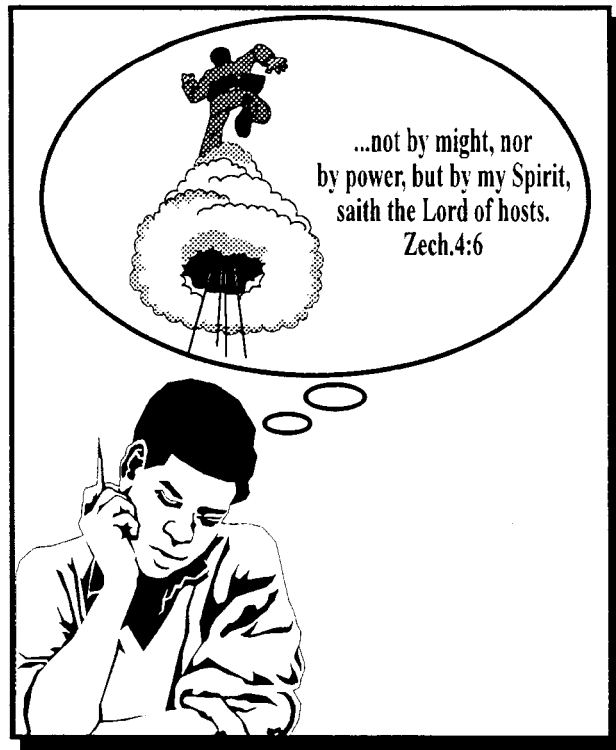

## Lesson 5

How do you get started in the traveling ministry ?

### THE CALL OF GOD WILL PRODUCE THE OPPORTUNITY

Trust in the Lord to bring about your ministry.

*Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.*

*In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.* (Proverbs 3:5,6)

Your gift and call will make a place for you. You do not have to push yourself on others, or step on others to get started.

*A man's gift maketh room for him, and bringeth him before great men.* (Proverbs 18:16)

Remember, there is a season for everything. Timing is very important in following God's instructions.

*To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:* (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

*He hath made every thing beautiful in his time: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end.* (Ecclesiastes 3:11)

Determine you will do nothing unless God is in it. Doing what God has instructed you to do, and refusing to be sidetracked, is a secret to being successful. Let God put you over. As He directs you, be obedient, knowing that He will confirm your labors.

*I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.* (John 15:5)

**BELIEVE GOD FOR A SUPERNATURAL BREAK-THROUGH TO START YOUR MINISTRY**

Be ready to take advantage of the opportunity when it comes. Many times we wait and believe God for something, and SUDDENLY God moves on our behalf.

**EXAMPLE:** The disciples were in the Upper Room praying, knowing that God had called them into the ministry, when SUDDENLY, on the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit moved!

*And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.*

*And SUDDENLY there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting.* (Acts 2:1,2)

Let God provide the breakthrough. You provide the willingness and obedience to the call.

*If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land:* (Isaiah 1:19)

Everyone who is in the traveling ministry has a different story. In my case, I had resigned from pastoring a church, knowing that I was to start traveling in the Body of Christ. I waited for approximately six months, knowing WHAT to do but not knowing HOW to get started.

God gave me opportunity to be head usher in a crusade that a well known minister was conducting in my city. During the course of the crusade, I seated a number of ministers in a special section which had been provided for them. One of those ministers asked me to come and speak in his church. That started the traveling ministry for me. And I have built upon the opportunity that God provided.

Billy Graham's big opportunity came when a newspaper editor instructed his staff to "push Graham", giving him exposure to the nation.

### CONCLUSION

Some supernatural breakthroughs only seem supernatural in retrospect. At the time it may have seemed that a very ordinary course of events took place, but it created supernatural breakthroughs and opportunities for ministry.

A letter of Introduction sent out to pastors can be very effective. This consists of a sheet of your letterhead telling about you, your ministry, and an address and telephone number you can be contacted. See the sample Letter of Introduction on page 16.

A letter of Recommendation from a pastor who is familiar with your ministry may accompany your letter of introduction. Pastors are concerned about having only reputable traveling ministers come to their church to speak. A letter of recommendation shows accountability and provides the pastor with a way of evaluating your ministry.

Small greeting cards with a scripture verse on the outside and a handwritten message on the inside can be used as a "Thank you" and "In appreciation of...". These card packets can be found in most Christian bookstores. You may also contact the address at the right for this type of greeting card.

TRANSPORTATION NEEDS

Using your faith is necessary for whatever transportation you use. Start your traveling ministry with what you have. However, faith is not a substitute for regular maintenance on your vehicle. Regular maintenance at home will cost less than emergency repairs on the road!

Tips concerning transportation in the traveling ministry:

- 1. Use what vehicle you have.
2. Always apply your faith toward it.
3. Anoint your vehicle and dedicate it to God's work.
4. Do regular maintenance on your vehicle.
5. Have prayer at the beginning of every trip, taking authority over the power of the devil and all evil forces, so they cannot come against you through the following: (1) Traffic (2) People (3) Traffic lights (4) Police (5) Wildlife.

CONCLUSION

This lesson has shown you some items needed to get started. Establish the call, establish the time, use what you've got, and expect God to bring the increase!

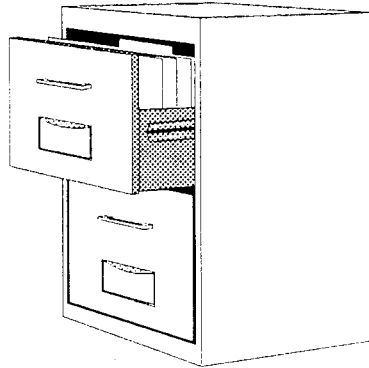

# KEEPING RECORDS - VITAL SIGNS FOR YOUR MINISTRY



## Lesson 3

Keeping accurate records for your ministry is a must! Many ministries keep records on their computer. This enables them to summarize the information and produce accurate financial statements.

### KEEP RECORDS FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Records provide a means of evaluating your ministry.  
Records help you make sound and wise decisions.  
Records enable you to plan for ministry in the future.

### FINANCIAL RECORDS

A **receipt book** is necessary to record all income and keep track of individual donors. Office supply stores have them for sale.

A **general ledger** is necessary to record income and expenses. Ledgers and cash journal books are also available at your local office supply store. See the samples at the end of this lesson to see what to get.

**Financial records** such as these are necessary to satisfy the legal requirements of the IRS, and to show to bankers when applying for a loan.

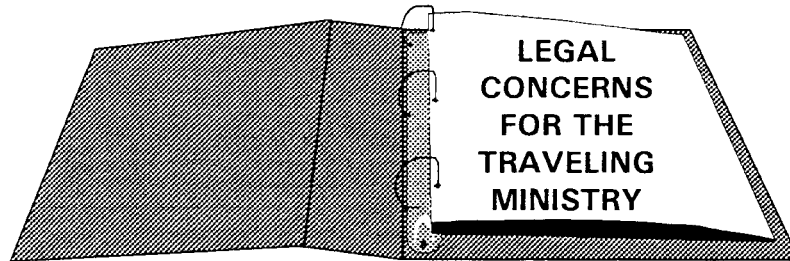








# LEGAL CONCERNS FOR THE TRAVELING MINISTRY



## Lesson 4

A traveling ministry must consider a number of things which affect it legally. For example, a traveling ministry should be prepared for the legal requirements of the following:

1. Incorporation
2. Tax-exempt status with the IRS and compliance issues
3. Tax requirements where not exempt in the states, such as sales and property taxes
4. Donor record keeping and reporting
5. Business operational issues
6. Minister's salary, housing allowances and ordination or licensing
7. Employment law issues, such as discrimination, labor/wage and hour issues, sexual harassment, hiring and firing issues, worker's compensation and unemployment taxes, and pension laws
8. Record keeping requirements of various state and federal agencies
9. Ministerial misconduct policies
10. Liability issues

There are also legal issues affecting each licensed or ordained minister who is part of the traveling ministry. These issues include, for example, various income tax regulations, Social Security taxes, legal liability, state requirements to perform marriages, visit penal institutions, report child abuse, and the

like. Here we will touch on general issues of incorporation and obtaining tax-exempt status.

**OBTAINING NON-PROFIT STATUS**

**The first consideration is whether you wish** for contributors to your ministry to be able to deduct their donations from their taxes. If so, your ministry must file an application for exemption with the Internal Revenue Service and be approved as a tax exempt organization. This exemption both qualifies your ministry as exempt from paying federal income taxes on income received by the ministry, and also qualifies donations received for charitable deductions by the donors. The IRS publishes a listing (Publication 78) of exempt organizations. Many donors are reluctant to donate to an organization not listed.

**A traveling ministry will normally be treated differently** under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") than a church. While both are exempt from paying taxes under IRC § 501(c)(3) and both may receive donations which are deductible to the donor under IRC § 170, the rules are different for a traveling ministry both for obtaining and keeping tax exempt status with the IRS.

**IRC § 508 permits group exemption. This allows** a church or ministry to closely affiliate with an exempt church and come under the "umbrella" of the exempt church. So a traveling ministry has the choice of affiliating with a church which has a group exemption by complying with IRS and that church's requirements, or of obtaining exempt status for itself. Several church organizations have IRS group exemptions and will accept traveling ministries. They should have a group exemption number from the IRS. Below is an organization which we understand has a group exemption and allows traveling ministers who meet their requirements to affiliate:

**Your other option is to seek tax exempt status** for your ministry. In the last ten years, the process of obtaining exempt status has become more difficult. Abuses have caused a stricter scrutiny of ministries seeking tax exempt status. It has also become more expensive. It is more expensive to try to correct a problem than to do it right in the first place, however. You should

security number. If you own or purchase real estate property you may be able to obtain exemption from property taxes, if local law permits. Your attorney and/or CPA can help you with all this.

**Once incorporated**, your Board of Trustees or Directors should meet at least annually to take care of corporate business. The board must authorize the persons who sign contracts and commit the ministry to major purchases or sales of assets. You should be careful to keep corporate minutes on board approval for every major transaction or decision authorizing the corporation to act.

**Record keeping, of both financial and legal documents**, is critical. Records of donations, both money and property, must be kept. Contracts and deeds and other documents of title should be kept in an organized manner and in a safe place. Files on all employees should be maintained, like in any business. The ministry should not reimburse a traveling staff member without receipts and good records of mileage and other expenses. Otherwise the reimbursement will be treated as income.

**TAXES: STATE AND FEDERAL**

As mentioned above, there a plethora of state and federal tax laws relating to non-profit or religious organizations and to licensed or ordained ministers. It is also recommended that you retain a certified public accountant knowledgeable in tax exempt organizations to handle the accounting and tax filings for both your ministry and the personal taxes of ordained or licensed ministers in your organization. It is also wise to let your attorney and CPA work together where needed.

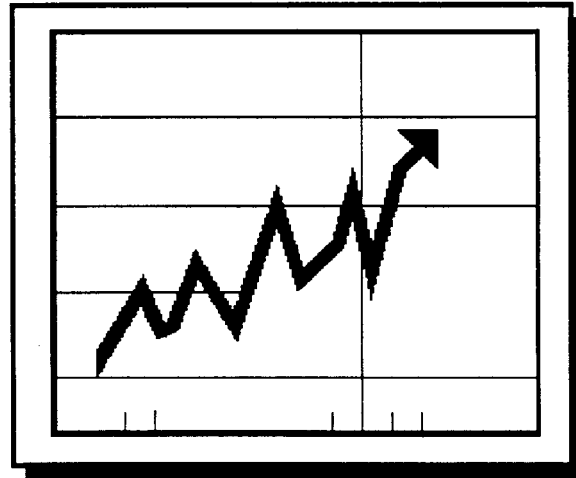

# DEVELOPING YOUR PERSONAL ACTION PLAN



## Lesson 5

Developing your own action plan involves several things:

1. Writing a Missions Statement.
2. Writing Goals to achieve your Missions Statement.
3. Evaluating both spiritual and natural conditions to meet the above two items.

### DEVELOPING YOUR MISSION STATEMENT FOR YOUR TRAVELING MINISTRY

**Make it specific.** Avoid being too vague or trying to say too much.

**Make it scriptural.** God will not flow with anything else.

**Make it brief** - no more than three paragraphs long.

**Make it in agreement with the call of God** on your life.

**Include the purpose** for your traveling ministry.

**Include the values** you adhere to.

**EXAMPLE:** Paul's mission statement was in agreement with the call of God upon his life. Compare *Acts 26:16-19* with *Romans 1:14-17*.

*But rise, and stand upon thy feet: for I have appeared unto thee for this purpose, to make thee a minister and a witness both of*

# HOW TO GET MEETINGS IN CHURCHES (Part One)



## Lesson 1

How to get meetings in churches without being pushy and keeping your motives right is an art that has to be learned if we are going to be successful in the traveling ministry. This section is meant to give some general guidelines for traveling ministries.

You must seek the Lord as to what specific plan of action He would have you to use. Ask God to reveal a strategy that will cause you to be successful. Next, be willing to live by the strategy that God has given you. Don't compare yourself with other traveling ministries.

### WHERE DO I START?

**QUESTION:** Who do you know in the ministry?

**ANSWER:** Who you know can determine where you start in the traveling ministry.

Some traveling ministries do "cold calling", that is, contacting people they don't know. Personally I have not found this method

very successful. We live in a day when accountability is a concern. The scriptures tells us to know those who labor among us.

In my traveling ministry I have worked mostly through **relationships** and **referrals**.

**Relationships with other ministers can be built** by going to Minister's Conferences, regional minister's meetings, and getting acquainted with them. Some you will "click" with and others you won't. Build a relationship with whom God seems to have put you together with.

**Don't be pushy** at minister's meetings by presenting your brochure to every pastor there. They are there to relax, refire, and to learn. If a minister asks about your ministry be ready to give them a brochure. If they don't ask, talk about their ministry.

**Go to a meeting with the idea of giving to others.** That will make you stand out in the crowd and cause others to take notice of you. I have often taken other ministers out to lunch just to develop a relationship with them. Not once during the course of the meal did I ask for a meeting. Sometimes months later that pastor would call me and schedule a meeting.

**When developing relationships** with pastors, remember that the relationship is more important than getting a meeting. Even if a pastor never invites you to minister in their church, the relationship is valuable. Don't go have lunch with a pastor just to get a meeting. They will feel that, and you may get a meeting from them, but the relationship will never be what it could have been.

**Referrals** can work well to get meetings for you. If a pastor expresses that they were blessed by your ministry perhaps they would be willing to refer you to their pastoral friends and acquaintances. Approach the pastor gently about this. Some pastors do not want to do this even if they like your ministry.

**CONCLUSION**

Remember, if God called you into the traveling ministry, He will open the doors of opportunity for you. God will cause your gift to have a place to manifest. *Prov.18:16* will help you keep things in proper perspective.

# HOW TO GET MEETINGS IN CHURCHES (Part Two)



## Lesson 2

How you make initial contact with a pastor is very important. Initial contact creates "first impressions". Usually within the first five minutes of contact the pastor will decide whether they will invite you to their church or not.

### INITIAL CONTACT IN PERSON

**Dress well** when contacting a pastor in person. Let your dress reflect the mission you want to accomplish. It is better to dress up a little more than necessary than not well enough.

**Manners, etiquette, and protocol** are very important. Taking the time to learn proper manners and etiquette can cause you to get meetings others don't get.

**Pastors notice traveling ministers who** show up at their church who are not dressed neatly, or who don't conduct themselves in an excellent manner.

**Using good business sense** is another way to make a good

### SCHEDULING MEETINGS IN CHURCHES

Often in October or November pastors are planning for the upcoming year, and may be scheduling meetings. The traveling minister needs to be aware of a pastor's schedule so they can be available to help them. This is a good time to contact pastors to schedule meetings for the next year.

If possible work your schedule six months to a year ahead of time. That is, in November or December schedule meetings for April through December. Pastors are more flexible if you contact them far enough in advance.

Give them a date when you will be in their area. Also have an alternate date ready in case the first date doesn't work in the pastor's schedule. Once you have your first meetings in a particular area, other pastors may schedule you in their churches too. This allows various churches in the same area to share the expenses of having a traveling minister in.

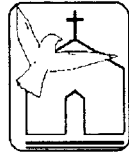

# TIPS

## READ ME FIRST!

**D**id you? If you started reading here, you're probably responding to visual tactics purposely designed to attract you to what would be the lead article in a real newspaper. Bold contrasts of scale, weight, and color make the head above and the drop cap left stand out from the rest of the page. The larger, wider introductory type is inviting because it looks easier to read. Placement, too, brought you here - readers of English are conditioned to start reading somewhere near the upper left-hand corner of the page, underneath the masthead. You probably looked there first to find a clue; the "Read Me First!" headline did the rest. By using simple design tactics you can cause your reader to respond in predetermined ways. Or in other words, you can guide the eyes of your reader to specific locations in your design. You can make your newsletter communicate quicker and more directly by using this sort of low-cost typographic and design strategy instead of expensive color and printing techniques.

## Type: the first tactic

This page is made up of little more than *type*. Different sizes, weights, and shapes of type give the page it's texture and interest. All the variations are accomplished through the use of only two type families. Times Roman, the lightweight serif text you are reading now, was chosen for its comfortable, familiar look, and Impact Bold was used for the headlines.

## Boxing Me In

☞ When you want to call attention to something on the page, enclosing it in a box can really make it stand out. Use this technique to underline a major point, introduce a new idea, or add supplementary information. The hand in this box is another trick to convince you that this is important and to read it right away.

**Maintain and guard your mailing list.** Your mailing list is a valuable asset of your ministry. Don't let other organizations have access to them. 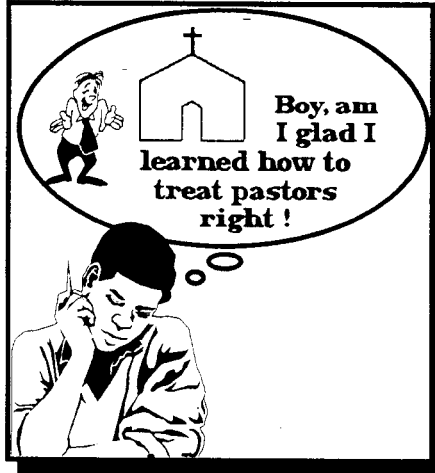

## Lesson 3

### AVOID COMPETING WITH OTHER TRAVELING MINISTRIES!

There is a good kind of competition where you press on to complete what God has told you to do. However, one traveling ministry should never compete against another. Paul finished HIS course that God instructed him to run. He did not compare himself with others in the ministry.

*I have fought a good fight, I have finished MY course, I have kept the faith:*  
(2 Tim. 4:7)

When you compare yourself with others, you measure yourself by a standard that God did not intend for you to. You will either judge yourself wrongly, or justify yourself falsely if you do. This can keep you from fulfilling God's plan for your life.

*For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise.*  
(2 Cor 10:12 KJV)

## Lesson 4

### SOME CONCERNS PASTORS HAVE WHEN TRAVELING MINISTERS ARE AT THEIR CHURCH

**Developing friendships** with traveling ministers may create a pressure to have them at their church. Traveling ministers should clearly communicate that this is not the reason for their friendship.

**Don't act super spiritual** - be yourself. Be friendly.

**Don't come into a church** demanding your own way. Flow with the pastor's vision.

**Don't invite yourself back** from the pulpit. Doing so is bypassing pastoral authority.

**Don't try to book another meeting** with the pastor right after you had a meeting with them.

**Don't use the church's equipment** as your own, or without permission.

Asking for traveling reimbursements is usually a "no-no".

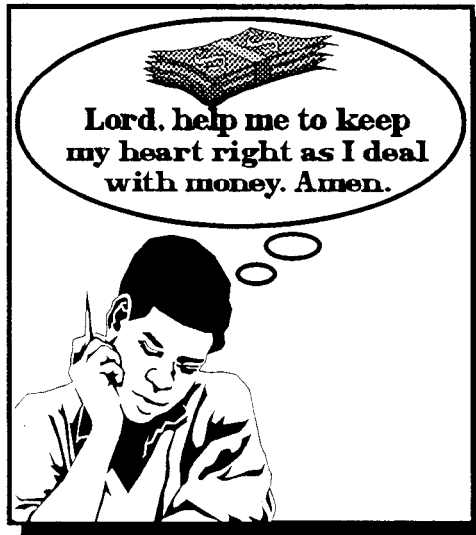








# PROPER ETHICS IN FUND RAISING

### WHY DO YOU WANT TO RAISE MONEY?

Your attitude is the most important factor in fund raising. Attitudes determine whether God will help you get the money you need.

1. Is your attitude to build the kingdom of God, or is it to get as much as possible for yourself?
2. Are you personally willing to give first before you ask others to give?
3. Can you trust God while you're using a particular program to raise funds? If not, it may be wise to wait until you can.
4. Does money have its proper place in your life?

Your motive, or intent, is also very important.

1. What are you going to use the money for?
2. Is this project God's direction for you, or something you want to do?
3. You cannot expect God to answer your request if you ask with the wrong motive, or if it isn't the will of God for you.

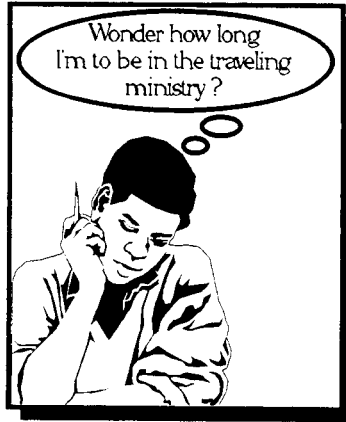

Look at the original direction you received from God. Often the ultimate plan and purpose for your life is revealed there.

### THE TRAVELING MINISTRY - FOR TRAINING, OR TO FULFILL THE CALL OF GOD?

God uses various things to train us. Every step is valuable. God does not waste anything.

Rev. Kenneth E. Hagin states that every traveling minister ought to pastor for awhile, and every pastor ought to be in the traveling ministry for awhile.

### LONGEVITY REQUIRES YOU TO GET INVOLVED IN ACCOMPLISHING SOMETHING BIGGER THAN YOU - IT WILL GIVE YOU A PURPOSE IN BEING WHAT YOU ARE

Whether you are to be in the traveling ministry for a season, or for a lifetime, preparing for longevity is a must. You must think in terms of meeting goals in the future, rather than just live for the immediate present.

### DIFFERENT LEVELS OF THE TRAVELING MINISTRY

1. **The first level** are those who are just beginning in the traveling ministry.
2. **The second level** are those who have been in the traveling ministry for awhile, but are struggling to get established.
3. **The third level** are those who are established in the traveling ministry, and getting meetings is not a problem.
4. **The fourth level** are those who are established and known nationally and internationally in the traveling ministry.

### IDENTIFY YOUR PRESENT LEVEL IN THE TRAVELING MINISTRY

**Realize your present level** in the traveling ministry is not a life sentence. It is not necessarily the will of God for you forever.

**Promotion comes from God.** He moves upon men to recognize your gifts when they're properly developed, and you are ready to function in them. Let God promote you and give you favor with others in the ministry.

# PITFALLS TO AVOID IN THE TRAVELING MINISTRY



## Lesson 3

This chapter is comprised of a list of things to be aware of which the devil will try to use against you as a traveling minister to derail you and keep you from doing what God said.

This list is by no means exhaustive, but it will help you not to be ignorant of Satan's devices.

### COMPLACENCY, (OR NOT BEING EVERYTHING GOD DESIRES YOU TO BE)

*...exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints. (Jude 1:3)*

*Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love.*

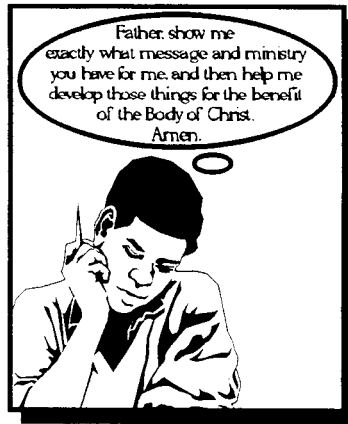

**When you first start ministering** you'll copy those who have influenced you greatly.

**As time goes on,** between spending time with God and becoming secure and able in the call of God upon your life, your own style of teaching and preaching will come forth.

# TRAVELING INTERNATIONALLY



## Lesson 1

Traveling internationally is a different realm all together than just traveling in America. It requires a different approach, different equipment, and dealing with different cultures, but you still preach the same Gospel of Jesus Christ.

### GETTING READY TO TRAVEL ABROAD

**Are you sent, or just going?** When God sends you, you're going in God's timing. Then you know God will provide.

**Allow plenty of planning time.** Usually 30 days to six months is necessary. There are international traveling experts who can help you plan your trip, answer any questions you may have, and get your airline tickets for you. you. Ask your contact to instruct you on things concerning their culture that you need to know. When possible, flow with the church's wants, customs, and traditions.

**Preach the Word of God.** Declare the Gospel is the power of God to them. Do not compromise the Gospel with the people on the issue of salvation. That is why you are there. On matters other than salvation, try to be as flexible as possible. Realize those people will change as they receive understanding of the Word of God. You can't force change on people on a short term basis. It takes time for people to grow in the Lord.

1. **Avoid addressing** customs and traditions.
2. **Don't try to Americanize the people.** Lead the people to Christ, but also let them be who they are in their culture.
3. **Be prepared to minister healing** by the power of God, and deal with evil spirits if necessary.

## CONCLUSION

We must adopt the same attitude Paul stated that he had so we may be effective ministers worldwide.

*What is my reward then? Verily that, when I preach the gospel, I may make the gospel of Christ without charge, that I abuse not my power in the gospel.*

*For though I be free from all men, yet have I made myself servant unto all, that I might gain the more.*

*And unto the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might gain the Jews; to them that are under the law, as under the law, that I might gain them that are under the law;*

*To them that are without law, as without law, (being not without law to God, but under the law to Christ,) that I might gain them that are without law.*

# TRAVELING MUSIC MINISTRIES



## Lesson 5

### SETTING UP YOUR MEETINGS IN CHURCHES

**Flowing with the pastor is a must.** Be flexible in your ministry requirements and desires. Every situation is different.

**Promotion resources can include** posters and demo tapes sent to churches as needed. Be sure your demo tape is up to date with what you're currently doing. A demo tape of up to date music is better even though it may not have been done in a professional studio, than a professional music tape you did ten years ago.

**Ask about the PA equipment in the church** you're going to and evaluate your needs. Do you need to bring more of your own equipment to do what you want to do?

1. **Most musicians are very particular about** what comes through their monitors. However, be careful you hear what the audience is hearing also, so proper adjustments can be made.
2. **An option you may consider to establish consistency** in the sound of your music from place to place is to have your own small mixing board, monitors, and speakers on the platform with you and run the sound through a line into the church PA
