AND NOW ABIDETH FAITH, HOPE, CHARITY, THESE THREE; BUT THE GREATEST OF THESE IS CHARITY.

— 1 CORINTHIANS 13:13

n First Corinthians 13:13, the *King James Version* of the Bible translates the word "love" as "charity." Actually, it is to be regretted that the word "agape," the Greek word meaning the love of God or the God-kind of love, was translated as "charity" because it doesn't really express the full meaning of the Greek word that is used in this verse.

According to the dictionary, the word "charity" means a benevolent goodwill toward or love of humanity. But the actual Greek word that is used here in First Corinthians 13 is *agape*, which means "the love of God." Elsewhere in the New Testament, the word *agape* is translated "love" instead of "charity."

For example, in First John 4:8, the Bible literally says, "God is agape." In other words, God is love. So the word *agape* means the God-kind of love.

What is *agape* or the love of God? Before I answer that, let me show you something interesting about the love of God. The Bible says that love is greater than either faith or hope (1 Cor. 13:13). Why is God's love greater than faith or hope?

First of all, faith won't work without love. In other words, faith is dependent on love in order to work. Galatians 5:6 says, "For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but FAITH WHICH WORKETH BY LOVE."

You can readily see that love would have to be greater if faith won't work without it. It takes love to make faith work.

Second, faith won't work without hope. The *New English Bible* translation of Hebrews 11:1 says, "Faith gives substance to our hopes." You have to hope for something before your faith can give substance to it. So faith is also dependent on hope.

HEBREWS 11:1

1 Now FAITH is the substance of things HOPED FOR, the evidence of things not seen.

You see, if you don't hope for anything, your faith can't work because it

has no goal or object for which to believe God. Therefore, faith can't work without hope, and faith is dependent on love in order to work. That's why the Bible says that love is greater than either hope or faith.

1 CORINTHIANS 13:1-3

- 1 Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity [the God-kind of love], I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal.
- 2 And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity [the God-kind of love], I am nothing.
- 3 And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity [the God-kind of love], it profiteth me nothing.

The Bible says that even if all the gifts of the Spirit manifested through us, without God's love, it wouldn't profit us anything! It would be as nothing at all. Think about that!

If we understood all mysteries and possessed all knowledge and all faith, but we didn't have God's love operating in us and flowing through us, it wouldn't profit us anything! Even selfsacrifice and giving to the poor are nothing unless we are motivated by

Nothing you do will profit you unless it's done from the motive of God's love. You can readily see why the God-kind of love is so important and why the Bible says it's greater than faith and hope.

Also, the Bible says that it's by love — God's love in us — that all men will know that we are His disciples (John 13:35). The Bible didn't say that it is by faith or hope that all men will know we are His disciples. No, it's by God's love demonstrated in and through us that people will know we are Christians.

JOHN 13:35

35 By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, IF YE HAVE LOVE ONE TO ANOTHER.

How is the world going to know we are Christians? Because we love one another!

If the God-kind of love is so important, we need to know what it is. You understand, of course, that the Godkind of love is not the same as natural human love. Natural human love can turn to hatred overnight, but God's love never fails.

We find God's love defined in First Corinthians chapter 13.

1 CORINTHIANS 13:4-8 (Amplified)

- 4 Love endures long and is patient and kind; love never is envious nor boils over with jealousy, is not boastful or vainglorious, does not display itself haughtily.
- 5 It is not conceited (arrogant and inflated with pride); it is not rude (unmannerly) and does not act unbecomingly. Love (God's love in us) does not insist on its own rights or its own way, for it is not self-seeking; it is not touchy or fretful or resentful; it takes no account of the evil done to it [it pays no attention to a suffered wrong].
- 6 It does not rejoice at injustice and unrighteousness, but rejoices when right and truth prevail.

Not only does God's love endure forever, but the Bible says that God's love endures everything that may come along. What does it mean to endure everything? Verse 7 says, "Love bears up under anything and everything that comes . . ." (Amplified). Its hopes are fadeless, and the love of God will never fail.

I wish believers would take time to let this passage in First Corinthians soak into their minds and hearts. Just walking in the light of these verses would solve so many of their problems.

For example, notice First Corinthians 13:4: "Love endures long and is patient and kind." Now some people endure long, but they're not patient and kind while they're enduring! They endure long just because they have to,

- 7 Love bears up under anything and everything that comes, is ever ready to believe the best of every person, its hopes are fadeless under all circumstances, and it endures everything [without weakeningl.
- 8 Love never fails Inever fades out or becomes obsolete or comes to an endl. As for prophecy (the gift of interpreting the divine will and purpose), it will be fulfilled and pass away; as for tongues, they will be destroyed and cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away [that is, it will lose its value and be superseded by truth].

You see, God's love is greater than all these things Paul lists here. It's greater than prophecies, tongues, and knowledge. Why is it greater? Because one day, all those things will vanish and pass away. We won't need them anymore. But God's love will never pass away.

There will be no tongue-talking in Heaven, no prophesying, no word of knowledge or any of the gifts of the Spirit in operation in Heaven. Those things will have passed away. But love — the God-kind of love — will endure forever. It won't pass away, because God is love, and He is eternal! but they let everyone know they're enduring!

For example, sometimes a husband suffers and puts up with things because of his wife, but he's not too kind while he does it. Or sometimes a wife has to suffer and put up with some things about her husband, but she lets him know she's suffering!

However, the God-kind of love endures long and is patient and kind while it endures. And it doesn't weaken, fade out, or come to an end. It never fails.

Closely related to this is verse 7: "Love bears up under anything and everything that comes." You hear some people say, "I just can't love him anymore." Or, "I've had it! I just can't love her anymore." Love can. God's love can bear up under everything without weakening or coming to an end.

And since the love of God is in you if you are a Christian, you can bear up under everything that comes. Maybe you've said, "I just can't take this any longer." Or, "I can't put up with Soand-so any longer." But God's love working in and through you can!

Think about how God is putting up with all of us! I pastored for nearly twelve years, and I know that sometimes it can be difficult to put up with some folks. For example, I remember when I was pastoring, sometimes in the nighttime, I'd get to thinking about

how God puts up with us, and I'd start laughing about it.

I'd say to the Lord, "Lord, I'm wanting to get impatient with some folks, and here You are putting up with all of us!"

Well, God wouldn't ask us to do something we couldn't do. If He told us to love one another, then we can do it. Why? Because God is love, and we're partakers of His love which has been shed abroad in our hearts.

In fact, the most potent characteristic of God is that He is love. Love is God's nature. And when we were born again, His love was imparted to our hearts by the Holy Spirit.

fades out, or comes to an end.

Therefore, if we will just walk in the light of God's love, we will never weaken, either. We'll be able to just go on loving folks whether our flesh feels like it or not. We are to love people with the same love that God is.

You'll never be able to believe God fully until you understand and walk in the God-kind of love. Why? Because God is love, and the God-kind of faith works by love.

So to believe God fully and to operate in the faith of God, you must walk in the love of God.

The love of God will work in every area of life, including the marriage

relationship. Husbands and wives need to ask themselves in every situation and circumstance, What would

And if each one of us wants to grow and develop in the God-kind of love, before we respond to people, we need to ask ourselves the questions: How would God's love act? What would God's love do?


This is the way we can get the Godkind of love to abound in our lives! The love of God never fails, so when you put that love to work in your life, you will never fail.

Make this confession from your heart:

The love of God has been shed abroad in my heart by the Holy Spirit. I shall endeavor to let that love nature dominate me. I have God's love nature in my heart – in my spirit.

Therefore, I'll not let my natural human reasoning dominate me. I refuse to allow the flesh to rule me.

I will make the love of God my great quest in life, for then my love shall abound, and God shall reap the glory.

Gloria and I became acquainted with Kenneth Hagin Ministries in 1967 while I was a student at Oral Roberts University. For the first time in our lives, we heard the word of faith, and it literally exploded in our innermost beings. It was like the beauty of the first rays of the sunrise on a whole new world of the Spirit. I was traveling with the Oral Roberts evangelistic team hearing Brother Roberts teach those wonderful messages of healing and deliverance. Don't let the "giants" in your life defeat you. Face these giants and slay them as David did. You can be victorious over every circumstance in your life!

want to look at the story of David and Goliath. In life, we're not likely to have to fight a physical giant as David fought against Goliath. But we will face giants, overwhelming trials, of our own. And if we'll learn how David won the victory over Goliath, we can win the victory over the giants in our life

Let's read a portion of the account of David and Goliath.

1 SAMUEL 17:3-7

- 3 And the Philistines stood on a mountain on the one side, and Israel stood on a mountain on the other side; and there was a valley between them.
- 4 And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span [approximately nine feet].
- 5 And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of brass [his armor weighed about 125 pounds].
- 6 And he had greaves of brass upon his legs, and a target of brass between his shoulders.
- 7 And the staff of his spear was like a weaver's beam; and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron [fifteen pounds]: and one bearing a shield went before him.

Goliath's spearhead weighed fifteen pounds! And that's not counting the

shaft of the spear! And he was strong enough to throw that thing!

I remember a guy in high school who threw the eight-pound shot put. He was six feet, two inches tall and weighed about 250 pounds. He took the shot put and threw it like I'd throw a baseball. That was an impressive feat, and that was only eight pounds. Can you imagine a guy throwing a spear, the head of which alone weighed 15 pounds? I mean, that's a big guy! And he wasn't just throwing it a few feet. He was hurling it 30, 40, and 50 feet!

Let's continue reading in First Samuel.

1 SAMUEL 17:8,9

- 8 And he stood and cried unto the armies of Israel, and said unto them, Why are ye come out to set your battle in array? am not I a Philistine, and ye servants to Saul? choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me.
- 9 If he be able to fight with me, and kill me, then will we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and kill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve us.

I want you to notice that Goliath issued a challenge to Israel's best soldier so that the rest of the army of Israel didn't even have to fight. He was over-confident — arrogant. When you're dealing with the devil — your enemy and adversary — and he brings things against you, did you ever notice that he is arrogant? This giant, Goliath, was defeating the mightiest of Israel's warriors. He was arrogant because he was undefeated. He thought he wouldn't have any trouble.

Let's read what Goliath said.

1 SAMUEL 17:10,11

10 And the Philistine said, I defy the armies of Israel this day; give me a man, that we may fight together.

11 When Saul and all Israel heard those words of the Philistine, they were dismayed, and greatly afraid.

Goliath taunted Israel, and in doing so, he was taunting God.

Now God had blessed the Israelites many times. Everyone in the army of Israel knew all the great stories of deliverance, even when they were under-manned and under-armed. God always delivered them!

But in this situation with Goliath, everyone in Israel's camp was shaking in his boots, so to speak. They were paralyzed by fear because one man stood up and began to roar. Goliath swaggered back and forth in supreme confidence, intimidating all the Israelites until they became incapable of action.

I want you to realize that there hadn't been a fight yet. No one had drawn a bow or thrown a spear. Yet the army of Israel was talking defeat. They were already defeated, and there hadn't even been a fight! It was their fear of the situation that caused them defeat before the battle ever began.

Many times, the enemy comes at you with difficult circumstances and obstacles. And when you become paralyzed with fear, you're defeated before you ever get in the battle.

Israel forgot all the things God had done for them. They were running in terror and defeat from Goliath.

Let's continue reading in verse 22.

1 SAMUEL 17:22-24

22 And David left his carriage in the hand of the keeper of the carriage, and ran into the army, and came and saluted his brethren.

23 And as he talked with them, behold, there came up the champion, the Philistine of Gath, Goliath by name, out of the armies of the Philistines, and spake according to the same words: and David heard them.

24 And all the men of Israel, when they saw the man, fled from him, and were sore

Verse 24 says that when the Israelites saw the man named Goliath. they fled from him and were very afraid. (Sometimes we flee just because the devil sticks his head up.) When this man walked out on the hillside, everyone started running for cover! He hadn't thrown a spear or shot an arrow. All he had done was issue a challenge.

Did you ever notice that the devil is always talking about what he's going to do? He tries to intimidate you, because if he can intimidate you, he the situation that knows that you will not caused them defeat think correctly; you will not think in line with God's Word. Therefore, you'll not believe and talk in line with God's Word. And the devil will defeat you before you ever get to the battle!

But notice that David had a totally different reaction.

1 SAMUEL 17:25,26

25 And the men of Israel said, Have ye seen this man that is come up? surely to defy Israel is he come up: and it shall be, that the man who killeth him, the king will enrich him with great riches, and will give him his daughter, and make his father's house free in Israel.

26 And David spake to the men that stood by him, saying, What shall be done to the man that killeth this Philistine, and taketh away the reproach from Israel? for who is this uncircumcised [ungodly, unrighteous] Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?

David had an attitude of righteous indignation. At the sight of injustice and unrighteousness, he was stirred to action. Our attitude should be the same. We should be stirred to action. Instead of feeling fear, David wanted to know, "Who is this ungodly person?"

When the enemy comes at you, you need to take the same approach. You see, the devil is still using the same tactics that he has always used to defeat people and keep them from receiving God's best for them.

David said to Saul, "Let no man's heart fail because of Goliath. I will go and fight this Philistine" (1 Samuel 17:32). Goliath was arrogant, but David was confident. The enemy of your soul, the devil, may seem confident in his ability to defeat you. But he is not really confident; he's arrogant! If you listen to him, you'll be deceived and play right into his hands.

But David was confident because his faith was in the Lord. Goliath was arrogant because he was relying on his own strength. No one had ever defeated him. His confidence was in his ability. and that was what made their fear of him arrogant and prideful.

It was

before the

battle ever

began.

In verse 34, David remembered the lion and the bear that he slew because the Lord was with him. Then he went on to say the following to King Saul.

1 SAMUEL 17:36,37

36 Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be as one of them, seeing he hath defied the armies of the living

37 David said moreover, The Lord that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine. And Saul said unto David. Go. and the Lord be with thee.

As David went out to face Goliath, Goliath roared and said, "Am I a dog that you send a kid with some sticks after me?" Then he addressed David: "I'm going to give your flesh to the fowls of the air and the beasts of the field" (vv. 43,44).

David responded, "You come to me with a sword and a spear, but I come to you in the Name of the Lord, the God of the army of Israel, whom you have defied. And this day the Lord will deliver you into my hand" (vy. 45.46). Notice that David didn't talk about what he was going to do. He talked about what the Lord was going to do. You see, it's not our fight. It's God's fight. David said in verse 47, "... for the battle is the Lord's, and he will give you into our hands."

Let's read what happens next.

1 SAMUEL 17:48

48 And it came to pass, when the Philistine arose, and came and drew nigh to meet David, that David hasted, and ran toward the army to meet the Philistine.

David ran toward this
Philistine. Too many times when the enemy starts coming toward us, we just stand still and wait for him, or we run in terror.
But, if you're in faith and the enemy starts to approach, don't stand and wait for him. Attack him!

Goliath expected David to back down or just stand there. But instead, David charged at him! I think that's one thing that caused Goliath to slow down. And David was able to run toward the Philistine and smite him right in the middle of his forehead!

1 SAMUEL 17:49-51

If 49 And David put his hand in his bag, and took thence a you're in stone, and slang it, and faith and the smote the Philistine in his forehead, that the stone sunk into his enemy starts to forehead; and he approach, don't stand fell upon his face to the earth. and wait for 50 So David prevailed over the Philishim; attack tine with a sling and with a stone, and smote the him! Philistine, and slew him; but there was no sword in the hand of David.


51 Therefore David ran, and stood upon the Philistine, and took his sword, and drew it out of the sheath thereof, and slew him, and cut off his head therewith. And when the Philistines saw their champion was dead, they fled [they ran in terror].

I want you to notice something about this biblical account. When one person is willing to stand for God and get the victory, the rest of the people jump on the bandwagon. They say, "Look what we've done!" But they didn't do anything! This teenager, David, went out to fight the Philistine. Only after David killed Goliath did the rest of the army of Israel go into battle.

When the devil comes against you — when you are facing your "Goliath" — I want you to remember not to be intimidated by the devil or the circumstances he brings your way. If you lose your job, if the economy goes bad, if everything turns upside down in your life, keep your faith in God. Keep talking about what God can do. Keep your confidence in God and His Word.

If you'll be like David and run to meet the enemy and the circumstances that challenge you, you can throw the knockout punch and come out victorious on the other side!

He told King Saul, "I, your servant, have killed both a lion and a bear! Goliath, the Philistine who is not circumcised, will be like the lion or bear I killed. He will die because he has stood against the armies of the living God. The Lord saved me from a lion and a bear. He will also save me from this Philistine." David wasn't bothered by how BIG Goliath was ... because he knew that his God was BIGGER!





Feelings Vs. Faith

In April 1933, at age fifteen, Rev. Kenneth E. Hagin became bedfast. Doctors said he had to die. Sixteen months later, he was healed by the power of God. This month, Rev. Hagin continues his account of how his healing took place.

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At this time, I didn't fully understand faith. I prayed and prayed, but I didn't get any results. I was sure that God heard me; I had a good feeling inside me. Yet my heart still wasn't beating normally.

What I didn't know then is that we have to go by faith, not by our feelings. We have to stand on the promises in God's Word and not look at the circumstances surrounding us.

I did improve to the extent that I was able to use my hands. Sometimes Granny would prop me up in bed for a short time. I would reach down and feel my legs. There was no muscle at all, just bone. I was extremely skinny.

I seemed to be making no real headway, and I said, "Lord, I thought You would heal me." I was so sure that He had heard me, but I felt no better. I know now that just feeling better after you pray is no sign that God heard you; likewise, feeling no better after you pray is no sign that God didn't hear you!

For months I struggled this way before I learned that we cannot rely on how we feel. We have to come back to what God's Word says about the matter.

When New Year's Day 1934 rolled around, it was moving day. Grandpa owned several houses in town, and he decided we would move into another one of them. He had told the people who were renting this house that he wanted it for his own use. When they moved, he had it redecorated, and then we were ready to move in.

When the movers came, they moved the furniture from the other parts of the house first, saving the furniture in my bedroom until last. When they came to move my furniture, an ambulance came and moved me.

While I was riding along in the ambulance, one of the attendants remarked that he had heard I had been in bed for about a year now.

"Nine months, to be exact," I told him.

He said that if I felt like it, they would take me for a little ride through the residential areas so I could see the scenery. I was so happy for this chance to see things I had been missing for so many months. The smallest joys, which we so often take for granted, can bring immense pleasure to one who has been deprived of them for so long.

I was able to move my head to look out the window as they drove slowly through the town. Then the ambulance attendant said, "Son, if you feel up to it, we'll drive down to the square. Since it's a holiday, there probably won't be much traffic, and you might enjoy it." How wonderful, I thought, to

get to see that old courthouse again, the stores, and other buildings in this beloved little town of McKinney with its population of 8,000 or 9,000.

I saw the familiar old drugstore on the corner. I saw the J.C. Penney's store. Next to that was a dress shop, and next to that was Woolworth's. Then there was a shoe store, and on the next corner, a ladies' ready-to-wear shop. Then we turned to go down the south side of the square. I drank in all of these sights, not knowing when, if ever, I might see them again.

Just as we turned the corner and started down the south side of the square, I turned and looked at the old courthouse that sat in the middle of the square. I shall never forget that moment as long as I live. In that instant something said to me, "Well, you never did think you would ever see these old buildings again. And you wouldn't have, if it hadn't been for the kindness of the man who is taking you."

Then I remembered the verse in Mark 11:24: "What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them," and I recalled the verse that went before it which said, "... he shall have whatsoever he saith."

As I said it in that ambulance that day, tears rolled down my face. I didn't understand all that I know now. I had just one small gleam of light. It was like a little light that might creep through a crack in the door, but it was a beginning point for me this first day of January 1934 at about two o'clock in the afternoon.
